Try each note of these scales and arpeggios with this rhythm:



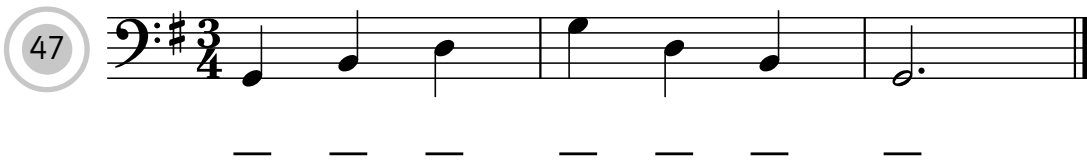
Football teams, your friends' names, your favourite animals, and food can all be starting-points for your own rhythms. Make up some more patterns of your own.

G major arpeggio

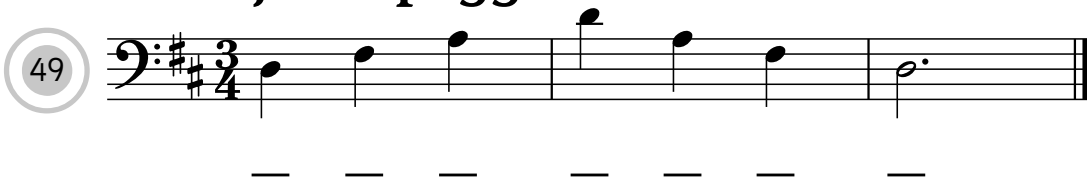
